If you are using this table from the WordPerfect file, insert the number of victims in the appropriate blank and the program will enter the scores for you. If you are doing this by hand, multiply number of victims in (#V) by the weight (the number in parentheses following the injury description) to obtain score for each act's injury category. Total columns for both number of victims and score for each act.

** Do not count time spent in an institution (i.e. hospital, jail, residential program, etc.) as part of the two years. Acts occurring within the two year period prior to completing this assessment are more valid in predicting violence potential than older incidents.
